COMMUNITY: Oak Hill is located in Herndon, Virginia just a short drive west of Washington,

D.C. and 5 minutes east of Dulles International Airport. The school is located in Fairfax County, a suburban county of 1.1 million and just outside the

incorporated area of Herndon, a town of about 22,000.

The school is adjacent to Arrowbrook Centre Park, a county facility with basketball and tennis courts and an Astroturf soccer field as well as the 2 acre Arrowbrook Nature Preserve. It is near Worldgate Centre and walking distance from the Village Center at Dulles and the new Washington area

metrorail Herndon Station.

SCHOOL: Oak Hill is a comprehensive Christian school enrolling 150 students from

preschool through high school. The school opened in the fall of 1997 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2009. The school is a member of the Association of Classical & Christian Schools (ACCS), Moscow, Idaho.

FACITLITIES: The school is located in 14,000 square feet of a beautiful building that was

once the home of Nysmith School. It includes 13 classrooms, one of which serves as a science lab, a 2,000 square foot gym, a library and a play yard. Physical Education classes meet at Arrowbrook Centre Park and at Worldgate

Athletic Club.

STRATEGIC PLAN: The school's strategic plan includes increasing enrollment to 300 students in

order to promote economy and diversity.

CALENDAR: 175 school days per year; 4 quarter grading system.

UPPER SCHOOL: 11 teachers (7 full-time, 4 part-time); 7 with advanced degrees.

DISTINCTIVES:

The Omnibus curriculum is an interdisciplinary approach to literature and history instruction, treating three historical periods in chronological order twice through the junior high and high school years. The curriculum emphasizes the reading of primary sources, development of public speaking skills, and writing. Juniors and seniors are required to engage in a year long thesis writing process, culminating in defending the thesis before a panel. Oak Hill students earning a B+ or higher in this writing intensive program have successfully taken the AP English Language and Composition examination; 100% of the exams were scored 3 or higher. Students not participating in the Omnibus are offered an opportunity to study history and English using traditional textbooks. The school also offers an ESL track in the areas of history, reading and English for new students coming from overseas.

Music reading and composition is a required annual course for all students. Courses utilize Kodály method and emphasize reading and analyzing music in major and minor keys as well as other modes, notating music, creative composition, analysis of melodic and rhythmic patterns, singing with good intonation and vocal technique, singing in harmony, as well as reading and performing more complex rhythms and melodies.

All Oak Hill students are required to study Latin during their enrollment. Students have participated in the Phaedrus Latin Contest sponsored by New Saint Andrews College.

The school offers science courses through **Biology**, **Chemistry and Physics**. Higher level math courses include **Trigonometry and Calculus**. While our core curriculum is designed to prepare a student for more than a particular exam, courses to specifically prepare a student for an AP math or science exam, AP Calculus, AP Physics, or AP Microeconomics or Statistics, can be and have been made available to students with an interest.

GRADING: Grades are not weighted for purposes of computing GPA.
